EDITORIAL



2020 will remain in all our memories as the year we all discovered to our astonishment the world's great fragility in the face of a pandemic reminiscent of the Dark Ages. Only one good has come out of this calamity: most of those who were dubious or still unaware have accepted the evidence of the connections that link all living things: nature, animals and humans. They have come to realize that when one of these elements disappears, the fabric of life is torn apart, the balance is broken, and disasters strike...

Since its establishment in 2005, Fondation Ensemble has been working on these connections in all its focus sectors. And in 2020, despite the political upheavals and public health crisis, we continued this work since the projects we support are run in poor and often unstable countries. Several new projects were launched: two (sustainable agriculture) in Ecuador; two (sustainable fishing) in Myanmar; and in Mozambique, already affected by terrorism, two biodiversity conservation and sustainable technology projects. The Foundation is also supporting 13 new projects to protect endangered animal species.

Commitments in 2020

6 programs were selected for a total commitment of 1,146 K\$, co-financing overall budgets worth 3 087 K\$, with a leverage ratio of 2,70 (\$1 committed for every \$2,70 of a project budget).

13 projects 'Endangered animal species' were selected for a total commitment of 121 K\$.

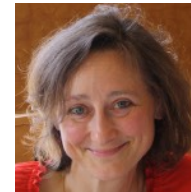

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

The Foundation supports initiatives that improve food security, increase and diversify local populations' income, through a sustainable and environmentally friendly approach, fighting against global warming.



SUSTAINABLE FISHING

The Foundation supports initiatives aimed at conserving fish stocks through a community based approach (setting up protected areas, fighting illegal fishing, conservation...).



BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION

The Foundation supports initiatives aimed at protecting or rehabilitating land and marine ecosystems of particular interest, through and for the benefit of local communities.



SUSTAINABLE TECHNOLOGIES

The Foundation supports initiatives that enable access to renewable energy, sustainable construction and waste conversion.

Impact Investment

After joining the Divest/Invest movement, which encourages shareholders to divest their portfolio from all fossil fuel holdings and invest in a carbon-free economy, the Foundation decided to invest in projects with high social and environmental impact.

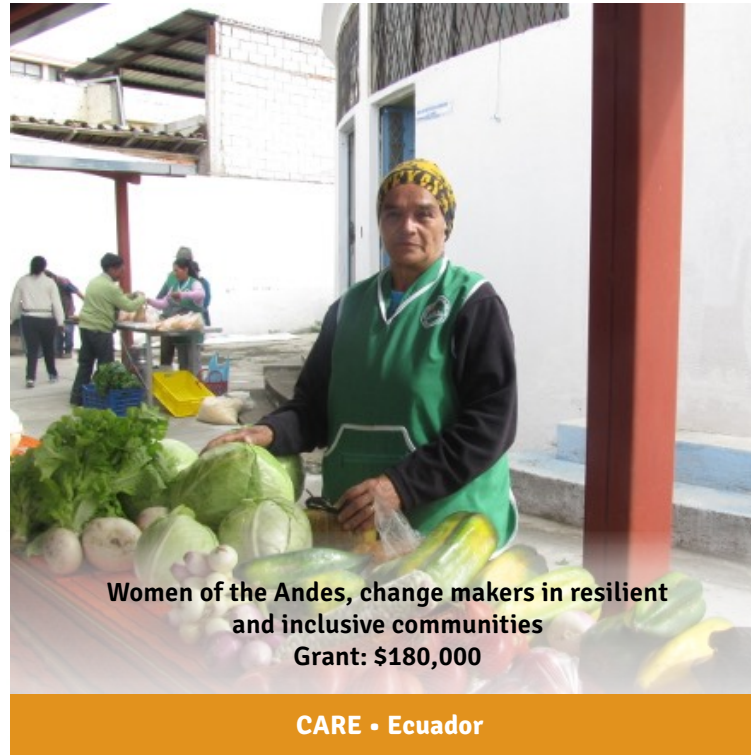

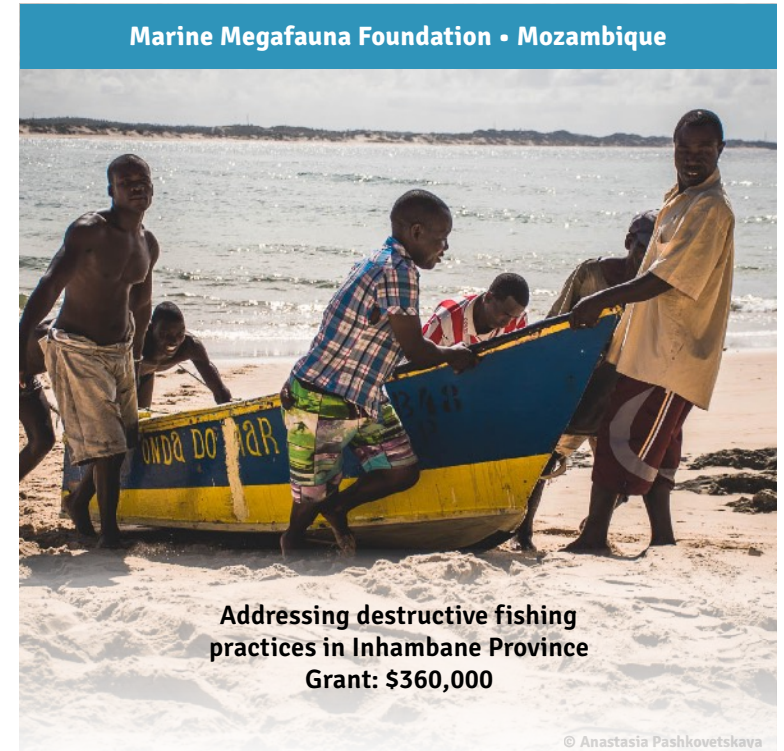

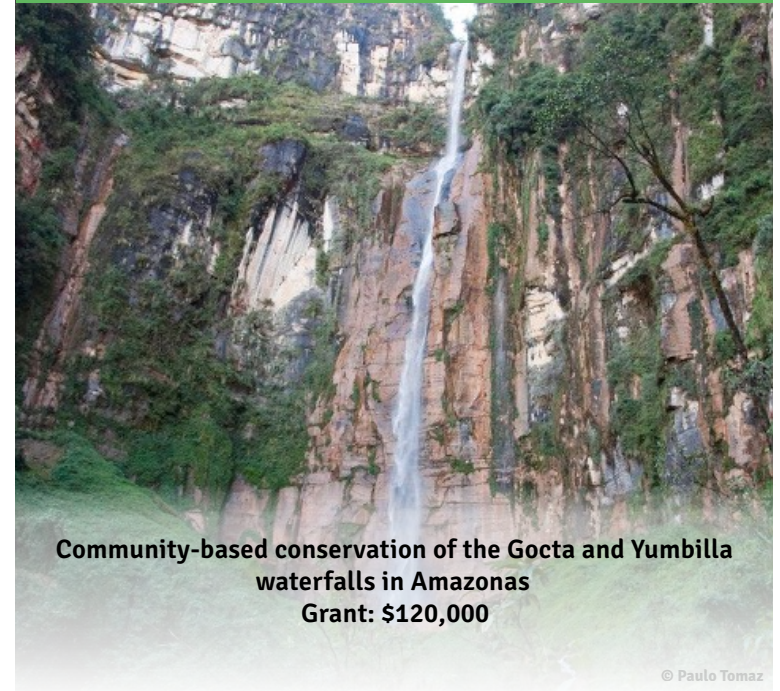

As a public interest organization recognized by the French state, Fondation Ensemble may receive notarized donations, temporary donations, usufruct, bequests, donations, dedicated donations, etc. It is authorized to receive donations from abroad. The Foundation can issue official receipts for the following tax deductions in France:

- Real Estate Wealth Tax (IFI) (75%, up to a ceiling of €50,000)
- Income Tax (66%, up to a ceiling of 20% of taxable income)
- Corporate Tax (60%, up to a ceiling of €10,000, or up to a maximum of 0,5 % of annual turnover before tax).

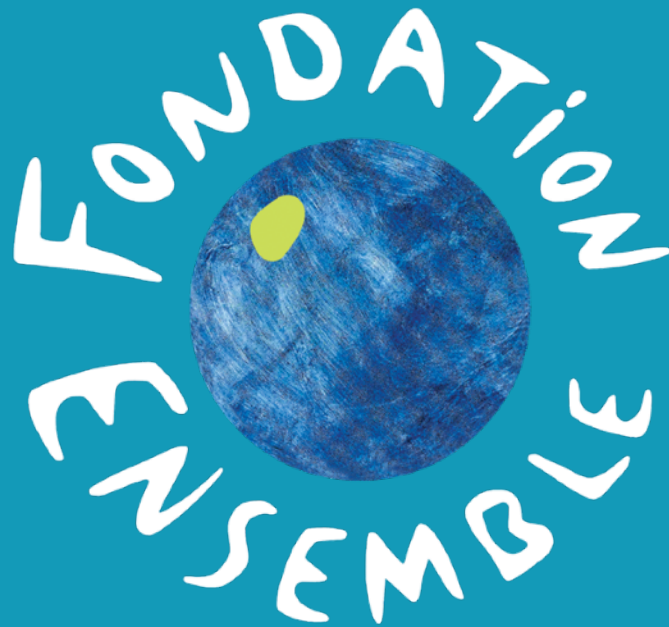
